Redevelopment of Former Jedburgh Grammar School Site

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Acknowledgements

Thank you to all those who responded to this consultation and who gave us their time, thoughts and ideas. We recognise the ambition residents have for Jedburgh and hope that the results of this consultation can be used in support of the redevelopment of the site as well as other projects within the area.

Introduction

Scottish Borders Council opened a consultation with residents of Jedburgh and the surrounding area to seek views on the redevelopment of the former Jedburgh Grammar School site.

This report summarises the community aspirations that were voiced during the consultation period. The site is an important space within the community and the consultation was designed to engage people in consideration of how the site could be redeveloped for the benefit of the town. In total, 636 responses were received.

Summary of responses received

There were 3 questions asked about the site and the top 3 results are summarised below:

Q1. What type of investment is most important to you to improve Jedburgh and help the economy grow?

- 1. Bringing empty and underused sites back in to use
- 2. Bringing new businesses to the town
- 3. Creating more reasons for people to visit the town
- 4. Of those who selected 'Other', the preference was to see investment in a supermarket.

Q2. What would you like the redevelopment of the former Jedburgh Grammar site to do?

- 1. A reduction in the need to travel
- 2. The creation of new jobs
- 3. Greater choice within Jedburgh
- 4. Of those who selected 'Other' most expressed an interest in seeing retail development

Q3. What would you like to see at the former Jedburgh grammar School site?

- 1. A supermarket is by far the most popular first priority for people
- 2. Sports park
- 3. Care home

The information within Appendix 1 & 2 details the investment people would like to see in the town of Jedburgh and what their priorities are for the redevelopment of the former school site.

Consultation process

Included in the consultation process was:

- An online consultation from 12 July to 21 August 2022
- Two community engagement opportunities held in Jedburgh on the 27 July and 9 August
- Paper copies of the consultation were available and distributed
- Direct email to local organisations to promote the consultation
- SBC Communications news release

Next Steps

Due to the lay out of the location, not all of the potential uses of the site can sit alongside one another due to the constraints of the site and the impact on the listed buildings. For example, the supermarket can only go on the northern part of the site which therefore limits the opportunities for other possible uses such as a sports park.

Former Jedburgh Grammar School Site Consultation Report 2022 [Type here] To progress with the redevelopment of the site, Scottish Borders Council will now work with South of Scotland Enterprise and look to appoint selling agents to market the site from January 2023 as follows:

Southern part of the site:

- Care home within the former main building (built in approx. 2000) and former infant block (listed building)
- Residential conversion of original grammar school (listed building)
- New build terraced housing fronting the Pleasance

Northern part of the site:


- Development of 1300m2 supermarket on site of former dining hall (not listed, and out with flood risk)
- Ancillary parking and goods yard
- Residue of site as activity park/riverside park

Scottish Borders Council will continue to engage with the community during this process. What ambitions are unable to be realised on this site, could still be achieved elsewhere in the town and these discussion will be part of Jedburgh's Place Making process.



Consultation Respondents

Respondents were asked to provide detail on their connection to Jedburgh and their age group to profile the consultation responses. Completion of these questions was not mandatory. Just over half of the 636 respondents live and work in Jedburgh and the surrounding area over a third live in Jedburgh and the surrounding area. A small proportion of respondents work in Jedburgh, visit Jedburgh or have another connection to the town.



It was mostly working age adults who completed the consultation with nearly 40% of respondents aged 41 to 60 years and just under 30% aged 26 to 40 years. Only a very small number of people aged 18 years or under completed the consultation.




Appendix 1 - Consultation Results

Question 1 – Investment in Jedburgh


Respondents were asked what type of investment is most important to them to improve Jedburgh and encourage economic growth. People were asked to select up to 3 options ranking them from their top priority through to their third choice.

Q1. What type of investment is most important to you to improve Jedburgh and help the economy grow?




Bringing empty and underused sites back in to use received 515 votes altogether. This was followed with bringing new businesses to the town (367 votes) and creating more reasons for people to visit the town (344 votes).

Of those who selected 'Other', over 40 people referenced they would like to see a supermarket go in to the vacant site.




Question 2 – Redevelopment ambition

Respondents were then asked to consider what they would like the site redevelopment to achieve. Respondents could select as many options as they wished. A reduction in the need to travel and the creation of new jobs were both selected by more than half of respondents (396 votes and 391 votes respectively). Just under half of respondents are looking for greater choice (312) and 270 are looking for investment in elderly housing.



Q2: What would you like the redevelopment of the former Jedburgh Grammar site to do?


Of those who selected 'Other' most expressed an interest in seeing retail development.



Question 3 – Priorities for the site

Respondents were asked to select up to five priorities from a choice of eight to describe what they would like to see developed at the former school site. Overall, supermarket was the most popular choice with 490 people out of 636 selecting this as one of their top five priorities. This was followed by a sports park, care home and then housing. Reasons for supporting a new supermarket include increased choice, competition and employment opportunities and a reduced need for travel (see Appendix 1). A sports park was supported as people would like to see more provision for children and young people in Jedburgh and it is considered an asset that will attract people to the town. It was felt a care home would address a shortage of suitable accommodation for a growing elderly population which would enable them to stay in the town. Housing was supported as means to addressing Jedburgh's housing needs including provision of first homes for young people and homes for people to downsize to in order to free up larger family sized homes.


Q3: What would you like to see at the former Jedburgh grammar School site?


Breakdown of priorities

A breakdown of priorities shows that a supermarket is by far the most popular first priority for people with 290 people selecting this as their top choice.



For people's second choice, retail shops was the most popular option, 38 votes above the next option of care home. Leisure amenities become more popular in people's third choice selection with a sports park receiving 118 of the votes and an ecological park receiving 87. A sports park remains the top choice within people's fourth choice selection followed jointly by retail shops and ecological park. A hotel tops people's fifth choice followed by an ecological park and housing.

Of those who selected 'Other' as one of their priorities, 20 referenced a choice that was available within the 8 priorities already listed. This was followed by a community site / hub and then a museum. These numbers however are small comparted to the priorities listed above.




Q3: What would you like to see at the former Jedburgh grammar School site?

* Existing option is used when someone had chosen one of the preferences that were listed in the question as their 'other' option e.g. supermarket, care home, housing


Although a care home or housing was never a top choice in any of the vote counts, overall they received a consistent number of votes to place them third and fourth priority overall and care home is only four votes behind the second most popular option of Sports Park which received a larger share of the third and fourth votes.

Priority by age group:

First choice results by age group show that just over half of 19 to 40 year old respondents place a new supermarket as their top priority. Just under half of 41 to 60 years old rated a new supermarket as their first priority



As already described, a supermarket was well supported by the different age groups. A third of 26 to 40 year olds rated a sports park as their first choice which possibly reflects their status of having a young family. A care home and housing had more support as a first choice amongst the 41-60 and 60 years and over age group which possibly reflects their position of looking to downsize in the future and planning for older age.



Appendix 2

Respondents were provided with the opportunity to explain the reason behind their top priority and the full response provided is detailed in the appendix. Popular reasons behind supermarket being the top choice overall is to reduce the need to travel, increase choice and competition. Many people saw the potential in a sports park attracting people to Jedburgh whilst also providing something for children and young people to do and something to help with the overall health and wellbeing people of people in Jedburgh.

Coop likely paid a premium to be the only supermarket allowed in the town' for a small town in a time of crisis with energy and food, and those not able to travel to cheaper alternative stores in another town, we require and I demand that a new store be allowed, which will bring jobs and retain the town's own community council would want the town's own services rather than HAVING to go lesewhere because they simply CANNOT AFFORD TO LIVE due to the prices in its one and only expensive supermarket. Jedburgh would benefit because there are a lot of houses tied to elderly residents who have paid a mortgage off in a 2-4 bedroom house that isn't required. Having my idea would mean elderly persons would have the freedom and dignity to have their own personal space and still be able to leave their apartment and go up the street WITHOUT having to cross a main road and having multiple apartments would mean less travel time between clients for care workers. The idea saves money and travelling expenses, being greener from not travelling between clients, safer for the residents who wish to walk along to get groceries or a paper in the morning and allows the independence to stay where care homes take away. It also allows younger families to get homes big enough to live in long term, keeping expenditures within the town.

It would be an additional viewing experience for visitors to the town. Scotland's once great and world-renowned brick manufacturing history is sadly no more but this industrial heritage is a story begging to be told. Brick manufacture propelled the industrial revolution and Scotland was right at the front. It would be a valuable educational and research resource. Currently, the website and brick collection is consulted by academics, archaeologists, historians and interested parties from all over the UK and abroad. Schools, groups, historical societies and individuals could all attend to further their knowledge of our once glorious industrial past. Talks could be given, practicals in brick making, artists and potters could have open days, PHD students have already attended and worked with the collection but there is scope for so much more. It would provide employment for those looking after the collection in situ and for showing visitors around etc. It would be a novel and unique feature for any town.

There is no social space in the town - nowhere affordable for the arts, crafts, music drama and youth groups to grow and thrive. Nowhere to run a cookery class or any class for that matter. But we do have football & rugby pitches, a golf course, tennis court, cricket pitch etc etc. Jedburgh is the most boring town in the Scottish Borders especially if you don't or can't enjoy sport.

Call me a cynic, but I think this "consultation" is just a bit of window dressing. I would be astounded if anything which was not capable of generating revenue instead of requiring SBC to put its hand into its pocket for once, actually came to pass.

This would maybe free up some houses for others to buy/live in, I talk to a lot of retired and elderly people who still want independence but would love a home all on the level (bedroom/living area/kitchen and toilet) we have a high population of elderly people now, let's help them live as independently as they can for as long as they can.

We need bungalows and housing specifically for retired/elderly people
