<p>There are more flags than those listed, which does not include the most recent Common Riding flags.</p>	<p>Collections or moveable items are not normally considered to be Common Good assets if they were acquired after 1975. However, we can consider each item individually, and if the circumstances of acquisition or the nature of the item, are intrinsically linked to the history of the Burgh, or to the boundaries of the Burgh (as opposed to some wider area) it may be appropriate to consider such items as Common Good assets.</p> <p>Given the nature of Common Riding these flags and the use to commemorate the Common Riding, it would seem appropriate to classify these flags as belonging to the Common Good. However, in order to list these flags individually on the Register, further information is required in terms of their description, origin and current location. Some flags may actually be held or owned by the Community Council or other community body, and may not therefore be appropriate for addition to the register.</p>	<p>Seek to obtain further information on any additional flags not currently listed which should be added to the CG register.</p>
